EVANGELISM REFLECTION

From Gareth Fitzpatrick, Diocesan Evangelism Enabler:

I can see how true the saying "Good news travels fast" is in my own life. When I experience something I see as "good news" my natural instinct is to talk about it with anyone who will listen. But do we have the same fervour to share the good news of the gospel? During the recent Bishop's Study Day, Revd Chris Russell shared insights from 2 Kings 7. Four lepers find riches. Initially they hide these. then relent, saying: "What we are doing is not right. This is a day of good news and we are keeping it to ourselves." Chris writes:

"Evangelism is simply the refusal to keep this good news to ourselves".
