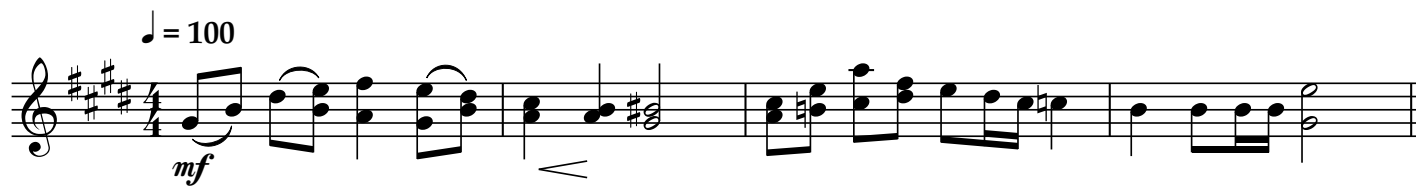

to our race so free-ly given,



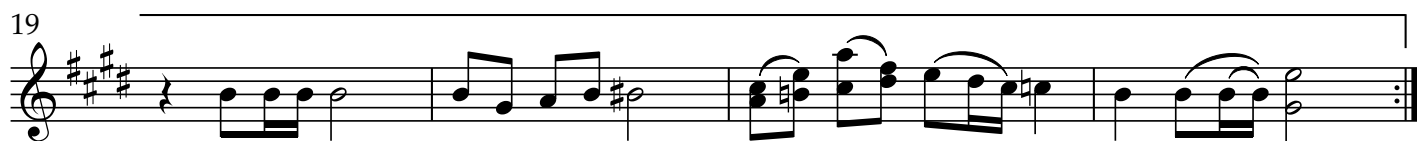

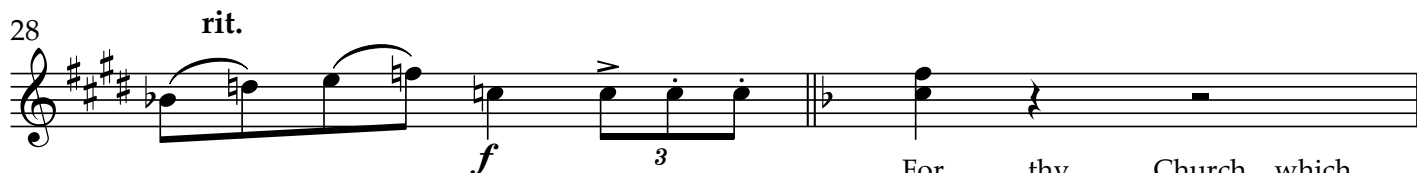
